SBS Electives (18 Credit Hours): Must be 300+ level.

Students will complete at least six electives in SBS. SBS students who do not wish to structure their choice of electives as a concentration instead complete two electives from the list of SBS "fundamentals" below, with the remainder drawn from any other 300-level SBS electives. CMCC HUS transfer students have already taken one course that qualifies as a "fundamental" (SOC 220). Fundamentals courses are: SBS 305, SBS 306, SBS 310, SBS 311, SBS 341, SBS 345, SBS 381, SBS 390 (course titles below*).

Note that transfer students from ECE automatically transfer in 2 courses as SBS electives, but no more, to allow them room to take upper division courses in the major.

Note A: Several classes that fulfill the core categories are *also* required by the major and can be used to meet *both* requirements.

- *ANT 101 Anthropology: The Cultural View* meets the SCA core requirement as well as a requirement of the major.
- *SBS/HRD 200 Multicultural Growth and Development* also meets the SCA core requirement.
- *ANT 101* also meets the DIV and INT core requirements, but can only be applied to one of these two. Other required SBS courses also fulfill these core requirements, and additional 'double-dips' are listed below.

Note B: If the Math Elective taken at CMCC is MAT 135, it transfers in instead as the required course for the SBS Major, LCC 150 Statistics for Informed Decision-Making, which also fulfills the USM core Quantitative Reasoning requirement.

Note C: If the Communication elective taken is COM 100, it will meet the CE core requirement. COM 101 does *not* meet that core requirement, and would transfer in instead as a general elective. If the Psychology elective is PSY 111, it will transfer in as the SBS required course HRD/SBS 200. PSY 210 does not meet the SBS requirement, and would transfer in instead as a general elective.

Note D: *LCC 370 Toward a Global Ethics* meets both EISRC and major requirements. LCC 370 additionally meets the INT core requirement. As a Writing Intensive course for the SBS major, LCC 370 may *not* be replaced by a lower division course.

Note E: Students can count ECE 297 as meeting the LAC 447 Internship requirement of the SBS major. **HOWEVER:** *If the student is changing fields or settings, an additional internship may be very much to their benefit!!* This should be determined jointly with their advisor. In that case, ECE 297 would instead be counted as a general elective.

Note F: *LCC 480 Senior Seminar* meets both CAP and major requirements. It is strongly recommended that students select a prevailing issue of Early Childhood care and education as the focus of their Capstone paper.

Note G: The Thematic Cluster requirement is met by any three courses outside of the major at the USM 200-level or above. Some CMCC courses transfer in to specific clusters.

- A course in government or civics (such as *LCC 220 U.S. Democracy: Origins and Development*) **is recommended as an elective** for students interested in careers in advocacy. One aim of the SBS degree is to build understanding of social policies and government processes critical to advocating effectively for one's clients, profession, etc., as reflected in the *SBS 430 Applied Social Policy* course requirement.

* Fundamentals courses are: SBS 305 Child Development, SBS 306 Adolescence, SBS 310 Childhood and Society, SBS 311 Theories of Personality, SBS 341 The Family, SBS 345 Diversity: Many Voices, SBS 381 Introduction to Globalization, SBS 390 Brain and Behavior.
